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The Courage to Speak Foundation Receives Funding for Drug Prevention Education in Bridgeport

The Courage to Speak Foundation is pleased to announce the receipt of a \$15,000 Donor Advised Grant from the Fairfield County Community Foundation for its continued work in the Bridgeport Public Schools. Awarded for the third year, this significant grant was made possible by a local donor who wishes to remain anonymous and receives philanthropic advisory services from the Foundation. This funding will support the implementation of the *Courage to Speak*[®] *Drug Prevention Curriculum for Grades 4-7* in many Bridgeport Public Schools.

The grant also supports training for new teachers on the Courage to Speak[®] Foundation's eight-lesson drug prevention curriculum based on the book *Sunny's Story* written by Ginger Katz, founder of the organization and the Courage to Speak[®] Presentations. Students will be taught communication skills to help ensure open honest communication with their parents and trusted adults about drugs, alcohol and other critical life issues and concerns.
