CEO and Founder, The Courage To Speak® Foundation, Inc.

Mission: Saving lives by empowering youth to be drug free and encouraging parents to communicate effectively with their children about the dangers of drug.

Founded in 1996 shortly after Ginger and Larry Katz lost their son, Ian, to a drug overdose and dedicated to fulfilling a promise Ginger made to Ian to do everything in her power to prevent this tragedy from happening to another family.

Core Activities: Educational presentations, proprietary school-based programs/curriculum, parenting programs/curriculum, books and videos that empower students and their parents to break through the silence and denial surrounding substance abuse to honestly communicate about the dangers of alcohol and other drugs.

Major Accomplishments

- **Delivered approximately 1000 prevention presentations nationwide** to schools (elementary through college), civic organizations, law enforcement forums, medical forums, provider and prevention organizations, corporations, conventions and other forums throughout the country.
- **Developed the Courage to Speak Drug Prevention Curriculum for Middle Schools.** Funded by Fairfield County Community Foundation and corporations, now in its ninth year of implementation in Norwalk, CT public schools. Launched in Bridgeport and Waterbury, CT schools. Start 2001 to present. Taught by health and language art teachers.
- **Developed the Courage to Speak Drug Prevention Curriculum for High Schools.** Funded by Fairfield County Community Foundation and corporations. Ten lesson curriculum taught by health class teachers.
- **Developed the Courage to Speak Prevention Curriculum based on Sunny’s Story for Elementary Schools.** Over 40 classroom teachers trained by the Courage to Speak Foundation reaching many schools since 2007. Taught by language art and health teachers for Grades 4-7. Funded by FCCF, corporations and grants.
- **Developed the Courage to Speak Drug Prevention Education for After School Programs - New** – Based on *Sunny’s Story* for students in Grades 4-7. Adapted from the Courage to Speak Prevention Curriculum for Elementary Schools
- **Developed the Courage To Speak Drug Prevention Parenting Curriculum *Courage to Speak - Courageous Parenting 101*®:** Launched in 2008, a free five-session course implemented by the Courage to Speak Foundation trained facilitators as a follow up to the Courage to Speak Presentation and or video. The program is rapidly growing and has been implemented in over 100 communities. To date, 60 instructors have been trained to teach this course. Now in Spanish. **Offered free to parents.**
- **The Courage to Speak Empowering Youth to Be Drug Free Family Night 2005 –2010.** Exciting event involving all aspect of the community.
